AMC Policy and Procedure changes

At the October 14, 2013 Board meeting the following Policy and Procedure changes were approved by the AMC Board of Directors. The policies and procedure become effective at the October 28, 2013 Member Meeting.

Board policy

(amended)

XI. Maintaining AMC Documents (eff. 10-28-2013)

- A. AMC official documents include the current Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, AMC Policies, AMC Procedures, newsletters, insurance policies, minutes of the Board meetings, copies of the monthly treasurer's reports, and other Club legal documents, as well as amendments to same.
- B. The President and the Secretary of the Club will maintain electronic copies of all AMC official documents in accordance with Archive Committee procedures.
- C. All current Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws and AMC policies will be posted on the AMC website.
- D. Changes to AMC policies will normally be published in the AMC newsletter following the Board's action and become effective on the day of the next AMC member meeting, but the Board may set a different effective date when appropriate.
- E. Changes to the AMC policies will be placed among the Members Documents on the AMC website as soon as practical.
- F. All AMC policy changes will be emailed to the Board, Committee Chairs and Outing Leaders when posted to the AMC website.

(New)

Funding of Non-AMC Activities (eff. 10-28-2013)

The Board of the AMC, or its designee, or the committee assigned to address and consider public relations and marketing proposals for the AMC, may from time to time consider proposals from outside individuals and entities for funding on non-AMC climbing-related activities or events. The Board shall consider the following questions when evaluating such proposals, and provide funding on a case by case basis if monies are available within the annual budget allocated for these purposes. If possible, potential funding opportunities should be identified and included in the preparation of the annual budget. Last minute proposals, while worthy, may be rejected by the Board outright if they are considered outside the AMC's normal funding cycle.

- Is the proposal consistent with the Mission of the AMC?
- Does the proposal benefit the AMC's standing in the larger climbing, mountaineering and canyoneering communities?
- Are there any negative repercussions to the AMC if the proposal is funded?
- Has the Board investigated and know the uses of the proposed funding by the applicant? What are those uses?
- Is the proposal more or less worthy of funding than other potential proposals? If the proposal merits funding, and there are alternative considerations for the available monies, then a hierarchy in merit worthiness must be considered.

If the Board has monies available with the annual budget and the proposal has been evaluated to further the goals and standing of the AMC compared to other potential proposals it may authorize such expenditures.

AMC Policy and Procedure changes (continued)

Board Procedures

(amended)

Policy administration (eff. 10-28-2013)

- We shall discontinue using Standing Rules, and implement only "Policies" for our rules of operation.
- There should be a single policy for each Committee and one for the Board. This will:
 - (a) Make it easier to ensure that we don't conflict with previous policy
 - (b) Make it easier to find any given policy
 - (c) Make it easier to give orientation to any new volunteers that take over a Committee
 - (d) Make it easy for the webmaster to post any new policy by just replacing the existing document in total instead of having to make new links for new policies.
- Policies should be posted on the website in .doc format (MS Word), so we can download them for revisions, and in .pdf format so that any AMC member can read the files.
- When a policy is to be changed, download the full policy and make the changes, then upload a complete replacement version of the policy.
- The effective date for any revised policy shall be updated in the body of the policy in the title section of where the change is made (see format below).
- Maintain an electronic record of Policy and Procedure revisions by archiving prior (obsolete) versions of the Policy and Procedures documents.
- When writing any new policies, use the format below.
- Blend in AMC guidelines with either policies or procedures.
- Handle AMC procedures in the same manner. Collect all current procedures into a Committee procedure, except the Board and multi-Committee procedures, which go into the Board procedures.
- Handle AMC forms differently. On the "Documents" page on the website, the link to forms should take the user to an index of forms instead of a single "Committee form," for obvious reasons.
- Format for AMC policies:
 - (a) All policies should be printed in Times New Roman font, size 10, with no underlining, no "all caps" and almost no bold.

Geir Hundal and Cochise Stronghold

Geir Hundal is an American Mountain Guides Association Certified Rock Instructor and a Professional Climbing Guides Institute Certified Multipitch Guide. He has been climbing about 130 days a year for the past 16 years throughout West Virginia, North Carolina, California, Nevada, Utah, and Arizona. For the past 10 years his efforts have become increasingly focused on his favorite place to climb, Cochise Stronghold.

Geir's presentation will center on a selection of stunning Cochise Stronghold traditional lines from 5.6 to 5.12, some of which are little-known and have seen only a handful of ascents. Geir will also touch on strategies for tackling routes near your limit and ongoing efforts to carefully replace the 30+ year-old bolts on Stronghold classics.

The traditional classics of Cochise have a reputation for being scary, exposed, runout, and stiffly graded. While there is certainly some truth behind this reputation, Geir's take home message will be that many routes that seem out of reach are possible with good beta, modern gear, up-to-date skills, and perseverance.

Geir's mission is to empower southern AZ climbers by producing and distributing great beta, providing solid, credentialed, and affordable guiding and instruction, replacing unsafe hardware on classic climbs, and role-modeling a ground-up traditional ethic. He also enjoys putting common climbing myths to the test in real-world scenarios.

AMC Climbing Anchors School - Fall 2013

The AMC Climbing Anchors School teaches participants how to set climbing anchors for top-roping. This course is the logical next step for AMC Basic Climbing School graduates.

Class curriculum:

Tuesday: Learn anchor components, anchor types, knots and hitches. Thursday: Learn anchor system characteristics and construction.

Gain experience setting anchors by practicing "hands-on" scenarios under instructor supervision. Saturday: Apply newly learned skills setting real anchors on an optional climbing day. This session is a climbing Sunday:

outing where students set the anchors under instructor supervision and then spend the day climbing.

Experience required: AMC Basic School graduate or equivalent, which must include knowledge of how to belay. rappel, prusik, tie a figure-8-on-a-bight and figure-8-on-a-follow-through, and make a girth hitch.

Cost: \$95 plus membership if not already a member (\$30 for an individual and \$35 for a family). Full Membership is good through the end of next year - 2014. Register by the Paypal link on the website (http://www.amcaz.org/ anchorsRegistration.asp) or if you need to send a check you can contact Nancy Lust amcanchorsschool@gmail.com for the address. No credit cards accepted. The registration fee is fully refundable if you cancel. Contact Nancy Lust by email: amcanchorsschool@gmail.com for more info. The number of students will be limited to 36.

Equipment required for the class:

- 2 non-locking "D" or oval carabiners (at least 2, bring more if you have them)
 - locking carabiners (at least 3, one of which should be a parabiner)
- rappel/belay device (Trango Jaws, Black Diamond ATC, Trango Pyramid, Figure-8, etc.)
- climbing harness
- 4', 6', 10' 6mm prusiks (untied length) 1 ea
- 5', 10', 20' slings (1" tubular webbing, untied length, AKA runners) 2 ea
- personal anchor slings (commercial daisy chains or 4' sewn Spectra runners or equivalent) 1 or 2
- helmet—required for Saturday and Sunday sessions, helmets are available if you do not have one.

(The slings and harness are the only additional equipment needed over the Basic School requirements)

This class is designed to teach you how to set top-rope anchors. In order to become independent and set your own anchors, you should start acquiring anchor gear. These purchases will be limited by how much money you want/have to spend and how much interest you have in climbing independently. The following gear is not required for Anchors School, but if you have some, you will be able to practice setting it in class. All of the gear recommended below can be used for Lead School, and none of it will be wasted if you intend to set your own anchors. All gear should be marked prior to bringing it to class to prevent confusion between it and other people's gear. If you don't know how to mark gear, check with an instructor before doing so to avoid weakening equipment due to improper marking.

Other gear you may want to bring:

- Any pro you may have (hexes, nuts, camming devices, Tri-cams, etc.)
- Extra biners (regular D's, ovals, and lockers—stay away from specialty biners at this time)
- Extra slings (perhaps four 5', two 15' slings, untied lengths)




The Grand Canyon Clean-up
