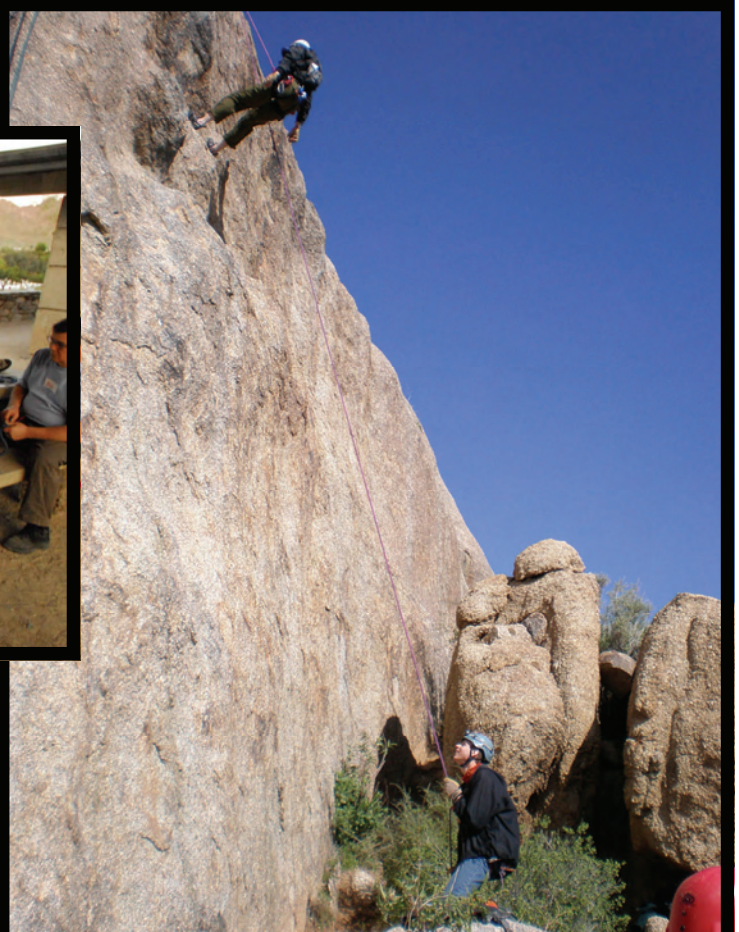

This is a 3 event team competition, which includes a 15 mile mountain bike ride. 5 climb's 5.7 or above, and a hike to and from the climbing that is equal to about 4 miles. Each team member must participate in at least 2 of the 3 events and at least 2 members of the team must bike. We are setting up for 5 person teams, but if you can't get 5 we are making provisions for 3 person teams. A minimum of \$50 worth of donations per team member is required. And yes all donations are tax deductible.

Repeat Ascenders is a group of AMC volunteers who teach life skills to at risk youth using rock climbing Founded by Danny Gonzales a Maricopa County Deputy Sherriff who has always wanted to take at risk kids climbing and , me Dave Van Hook Coreys' Dad. When I came to AZ after Corey's death I found my self working through that process by hiking Camelback and Piastiewa Peak. And one day I was inspired "what if we teach kids to be repeat ascenders instead of repeat offenders". Danny liked the name and we like working together. Over the last 3 years the AMC board and club members have helped make that dream come to fruition. Along with the support of valley rock gyms especially PRG. The best group we have worked with is by far is Phoenix Youth at Risk. But RA and PYAR need funds to continue to do the things we do with kids that actually want to make a difference in their own lives and are willing to work at it to make those changes happen. The climbing community in AZ is a group that has historically been willing to step up to make a difference for the community at large. And that's why we are holding the event at Queen Creek. It is a way for us to give back to the community's projects. So please get a team together and come out and play with us. Gambling, My Way!

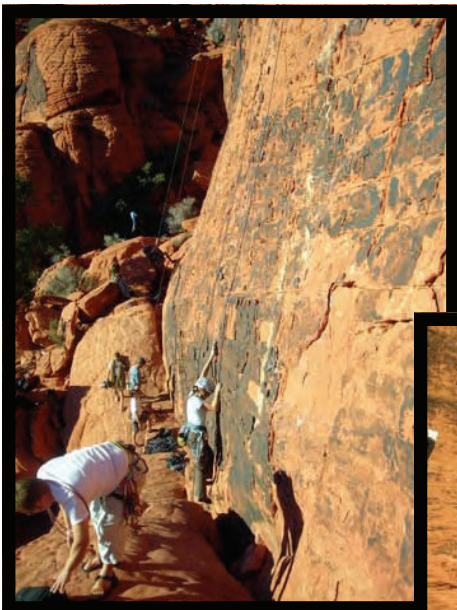
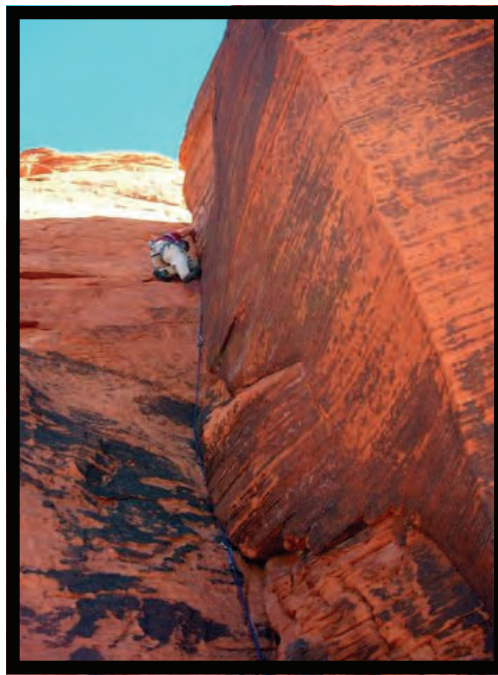
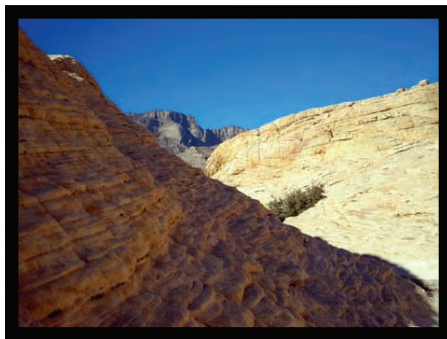
I finally made it to one of "the" climbing destinations. That's right, Red Rock. This place is so close to Vegas you can see the city when you top out on a climb. It's hard to believe that such a beautiful place is so close to Vegas. This climbing Mecca is officially, named Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area or RRCNCA for short and is located just 17 miles west of the Las Vegas Strip.

David and I decided to enjoy our day in Red Rock at the *Panty Wall*. This wall is accessed from the first pull-out along the 13 mile, one-way loop through Red Rock. After a 15 minute scramble we arrived at the *Panty Wall*, located north of the *Tuna and Chips* area. We were not alone as this is a very popular winter climbing area. But not to worry; there were plenty of routes to choose from. We enjoyed mild weather and sunshine throughout the day. We chose the Panty Wall because it offered some moderate routes, from 5.6s to 5.11s. We enjoyed such routes as "Cover my Buttress", "Silk Panty", and "Thong". The sandstone was awesome. We were able to do some trad and sport leading, as well as setting up some top-rope routes as we got tired later in the day.

We borrowed a couple of books from the club library, which were very helpful. We were pleased to find that a number of routes had been added since the club books were published.

Unfortunately, we had only one day to spend on the rock. No worries. We'll be back!
I would totally recommend this area to anyone interested.
