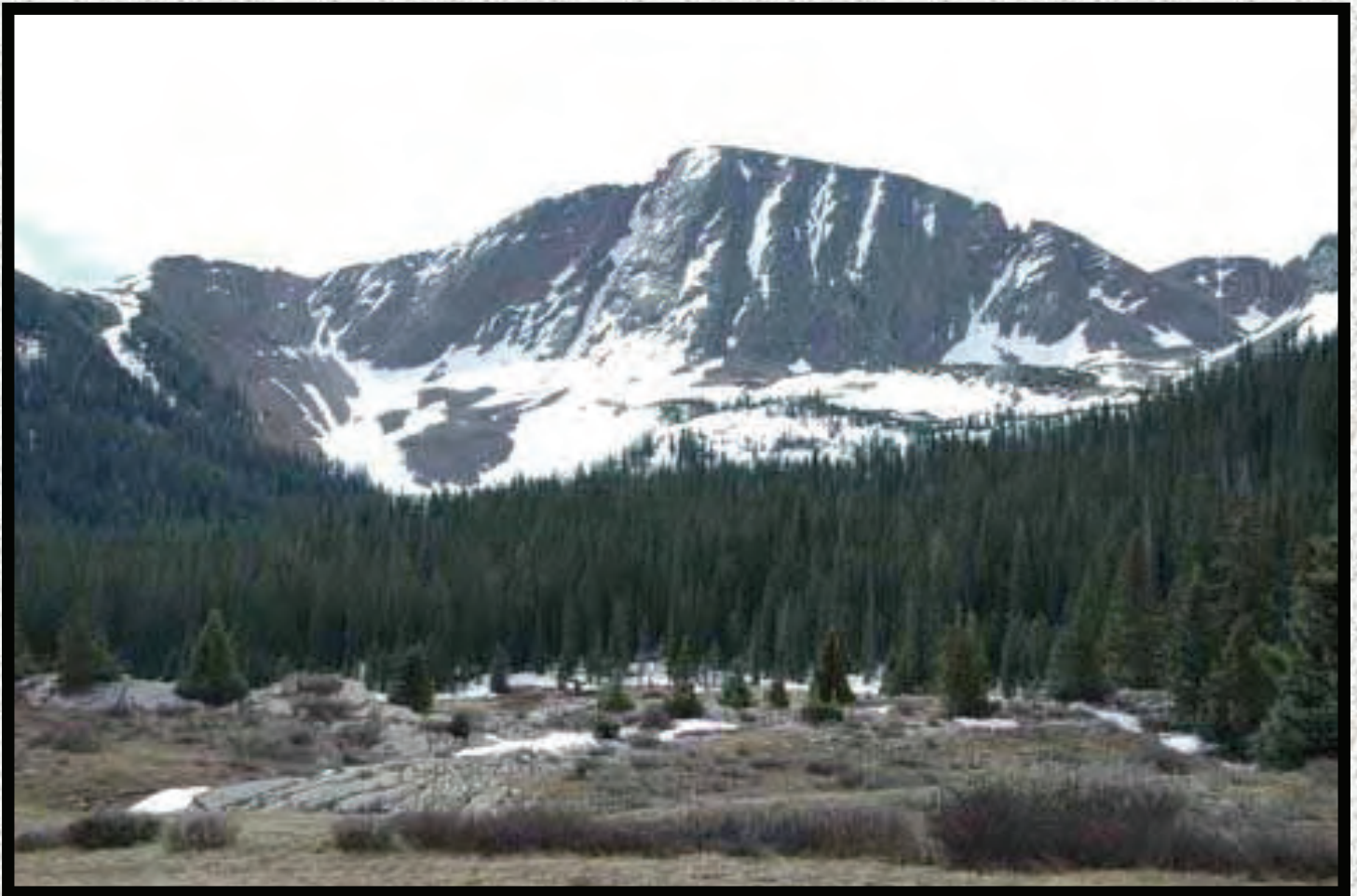

## Potential Catastrophic Equipment Failure

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Last winter I purchased and began using two Omega Pacific Link Cams. These are the cams where the lobes are hinged to permit them to fit into a wider range of crack widths. I have used the cams on about a dozen outings since then and have found their superior flexibility to be convenient and would even say they increase the safety of lead climbing. The cam's increased range means the probability that a chosen piece of pro fits on the first try is increased meaning the leader spends less time fiddling with gear while unprotected. My Link cams quickly became my 'go to' pieces.

As much as I love these little cams, I experienced a total failure of one last week while lead climbing 'Birthday Party' on Pinnacle Peak. I placed the Omega Pacific Link cam into a horizontal crack just below the short overhang on the route. After placing the cam I gave it a customary tug to ensure the placement was sound. Much to my surprise the cam pulled out and was literally in pieces. I quickly placed another piece into the crack re-racked the broken cam and continued climbing.

When I later inspected the cam I was eager to gain some insight into how it failed as I still had a second Link cam on my harness and its failure in use could cause my death. I determined the axle that holds the lobes and passes through the stem of the cam is capped with two end pieces. These end caps (they look like beefy washers) keep the lobes from sliding off the ends of the axle and ultimately keep the axle from coming out of the stem. One end cap which is flat and round is riveted or pressed to the axle and apparently stable. The opposite end (the end that failed on my cam) of the axle is closed with a small round cap that threads on. This cap is round and has a small circle machined or stamped into it which distinguishes it from the riveted/pressed on end. When this end-cap threads off all pieces connected to the axle including the stem itself can slide off the axle permitting a total failure of the protection piece!

My cam failed when the threaded axle end-cap threaded off allowing the lobes on that side to slide off and hang by their trigger wires causing the protection piece to easily come out of the crack. The threaded end-cap presumably came undone a little at a time during previous outings. I being unaware of this problem never thought to check the tension of the end caps on the cam's axle. I now check the axle end caps on my Omega Pacific Link cams at the beginning and end of every outing.

I took the cam back to REI where I purchased it where they were happy to give me a new. The gentleman who works at the climbing counter at the Tempe REI indicated to me he has received a report of a similar total failure from one other climber. REI is going to send the failed cam with a short report to Omega Pacific so they are aware of the problem. I am sending a similar note to Omega Pacific as well. If you have experienced a similar problem with an Omega Pacific Link cam I encourage you to report the problem to the manufacturer so that they can design a fix.

How each climber responds to this information will be different. Some may continue to use their Link cams with rigorous and ongoing inspections while others may want to stop using them until Omega Pacific acknowledges the problem and offers a remedy. Follow your best judgment and climb safe and climb until you are really really old.

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## Summer Reading: *No Picnic On Mt Kenya* - by Felice Benuzzi

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With summer nearly upon us, cool and shady climbs are becoming scarce. So when the route is too hot to handle, think outside the “box,” find a spot of shade and curl up with a good read. One such, is Felice Benuzzi’s “No Picnic On Mount Kenya.” While not a new tale, it is a true story of three Italian compatriots, interned in a British POW camp during the Second World War in the wild near Mt Kenya. Thoroughly bored with life as POWs, they set out to escape the camp, climb the 17,000’ mountain, and escape back into camp at the end of their adventure (there was nowhere else to go). Felice provides detailed accounts of their relatively primitive preparations, route finding, brushes with nature, mountain sickness, food rationing, summit attempts, and more. The story of their adventure is truly a testament to human spirit and ingenuity, drive, and perseverance.

“No Picnic On Mount Kenya” was originally published in 1953. It’s smaller than most guidebooks, has less than 250 pages and weighs in at little more than half a pound, so it’s perfect for a backpack.

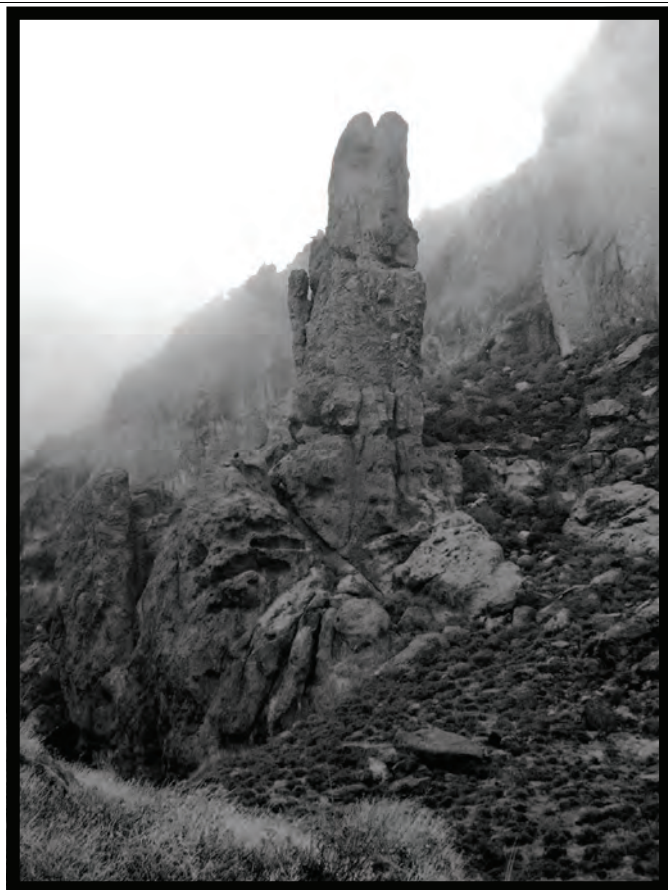

- Be approved by the Board of Directors.
