Board Meeting Minutes: 13th July, 2009

Board members present: Robert England, Grant Loper, Erik Filsinger, Kim McClintic, and Bill Fallon
Committee Chairs present: Mike Kreitz

I. Call to order. Grant Loper, President, called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

II. Minutes: The minutes of the June 8, 2009 Board meeting were approved as submitted.

III. Treasurers Report: The Board reviewed the Treasurers Report which had been distributed by Jodie Bostrom. The Treasurers Report was approved as submitted.

IV. Committee Reports

Programs: Grant outlined the upcoming programs. Jim Waugh is scheduled to present in July. Grant will prepare a list of proposed programs for the next 6 months and present it at the next Board meeting. Kim will be helping identify and make contact with potential presenters for future programs.

Mountaineering. Grant Loper reviewed the successful Rainier trip. Grant and Bruce will be offering a Map and Compass and an Alpine Rock course in the Fall.

Land Advocacy: Bill Fallon agreed to attend the City of Phoenix Open House on proposed new special permit rules. Erik Filsinger announced that the Access Fund has approved the AMC grant application for trail signage on climber trails in the North Access Area of the McDowells. Erik asked the Board to give him input on the trailhead design and planning for the North Access Area.

Erik updated the Board on the status of the Queen Creek land exchange. The AMC Board is monitoring the situation closely and is prepared to act when and if called upon.

Training and Schools: Bill Fallon discussed preparation for the Fall Schools. He will work with Erik to draft a request to the City of Scottsdale to hold the Outdoor Rock School in the North McDowells as has been done on previous sessions. The Board also discussed and approved requesting that on the weekend after the ORS the AMC will ask the City of Scottsdale to hold its Annual Adopt A Crag event in the North McDowells. The timing of the trail work and/or restoration project was determined to fit with a "give back" to the City for allowing continued use of the Preserve for its Schools and Outings. The Fall Queen Creek Clean-up and Climb events would be moved to another weekend.

Outings. There was a discussion of upcoming Mt. Elden Outing.

Classifications. Grant and Robert will work together on re-starting the Outing Leader Career Path program. As appropriate they will seek and solicit participation by named and possibly non-AMC local climbing dignitaries. They will make a proposal to the Board prior to enacting the Program.

Communications: Robert England discussed the newsletter and website activities.

Membership: There was a lengthy discussion of membership decline. A pre-meeting had been held and ideas generated. A discussion of the proposed steps will appear in the Newsletter when ready. It will likely focus on finding ways to expand our club presence in the main avenues to learning rock climbing, which in today's market are rock gyms. Grant will approach certain parties with projected ideas. The club will also renew its efforts to offer quality outdoor rock climbing experiences. Of particular interest are the transitions from indoor to outdoor rock climbing and from sport to trad rock climbing. Stay tuned.

Old Business:

Documents on the website. Erik Filsinger stated that the committee is wrapping up its review of published policies and should be able to report at the next Board meeting.

New Business:

Grand Canyon Clean-Up: Robert England will take over as coordinator for the Fall event. He is planning on visiting with Park authorities and will report back at the next meeting.

Adjournment: The Board adjourned the meeting at 9:01 p.m.

Lead Climbing School

Arizona Mountaineering Club - Fall 2009

This is an advanced climbing class. Even if you don't plan on leading, you will learn much about the dynamics of climbing, and it will make you a safer climber. Protecting a climb is a different skill from climbing itself. We will talk about the dynamics of lead falls, how to prepare for a climb, the differences between single-pitch and multi-pitch, and the differences between clipping bolts and placing natural pro. There will be no "true" lead climbs during the class, but we will provide simulated leading exercises.

Class curriculum:

Tue Lecture, slide show: introduction, the lead fall, equipment
Wed Lecture, slide show: equipment (continued); the process and techniques of leading
Thu Lecture, slide show: multi-pitch techniques, the descent, leader rescue, aid climbing
Sat Hands-on practice: natural pro placement (Prescott)
Sun Hands-on practice: leading on bolts (Prescott or Scottsdale)

Class schedule:

*North Mountain Park is located at Peoria and 7th St, 5 miles north of Camelback on 7th St. Turn west into the park. The Yavapai Ramada is the last one on the loop just before you exit the park.

Experience required: Preferably, AMC Basic School and AMC Anchors School or equivalent experience. This includes knowing how to tie a variety of knots, belay, rappel, prusik and set anchors.

Cost: \$75 plus membership if not already a member (prorated \$15 for an individual and \$18 for a family). Membership is good through Dec., 2009. Register by sending a check payable to AMC Anchors School to PO Box 11883, Tempe, AZ, 85284. No credit cards accepted. The registration fee is fully refundable if you cancel. Contact Nancy Birdwell by email: info@amcaz.org for more info. The number of students will be limited to 30.

Equipment required for the class:

The following will not be needed the first night. You may want to listen to the gear lectures before making purchases.

All climbing gear (harness, prusiks, biners, etc.)

Helmet—mandatory for all on-rock sessions

Specifically needed:

- 2 20' slings (untied length), preferably different colors

- 2 10' slings (untied length), preferably different colors

- Nut pick

- Quickdraws with biners—at least 5 per person

- All pro that you own, which may include cams, hexes, wired nuts, Tri-cams, etc.

- Consider combining with another person to have enough gear

Hiking boots or shoes with stiff soles for Saturday, climbing shoes for Sunday

Optional: kneepads for Saturday (\$3–6 at Home Depot, \$5 volleyball pads at sporting goods stores)

Grand Canyon Cleanup - A 19 Year Tradition

Time again for the annual Grand Canyon Over-The-Rim Cleanup! For those new to this event, this is the AMC's 19th year of providing valuable cleanup services at the Grand Canyon. We have scoured the slopes below Mather Point and spruced up the view from the ice cream store at Bright Angel Lodge. We have appeared in numerous home movies we have never seen and entertained scores of innocents who ask, "Did you climb all the way from the bottom?" (We always answer, "Yes!") Along the way, we have maintained a perfect safety record, partied at pristine Shoshone Point, and climbed the next day in the Kaibab limestone amphitheaters below the Rim. Come out and join us again this year.

The Cleanup is scheduled for Saturday September 12th. You must be an AMC Club member trained in the proper rappel technique and in prusiking to go over the side; non-members can help at the top.

Trash Rappel Training:

This is mandatory for anyone who has not participated in prior cleanups. Old-timers are welcome to come for a refresher. We won't be teaching any of these techniques on-site at the Canyon. Please bring all the technical equipment listed below to the seminar.

August 8 - Teddy Bear Wall at South Mountain Park - 8:00 AM-Noon - **No limit - No one under age 18**

August 22 - The Overlook at Oak Creek Canyon - 9:00 - Noon - **No limit - No one under age 18**

Technical - Personal equipment needed for the Cleanup:

- Helmet—mandatory
- 3 prusiks (4',6',10')
- 1 climbing harness
- 1 rappel device
- 3 locking carabiners (harness biners)
- 1 5-foot or 6-foot tied sling (depending on arm length)
- 2 20' slings and 2 lockers (for anchors)
- 6 extra regular biners for fire hose
- Hiking boots (no sandals or open-toed shoes)—mandatory
- Gloves—mandatory
- Long pants, long-sleeved shirt
- Sunscreen, lip balm
- Water & lunch
- Whistle—optional (just in case)

Schedule:

Friday, September 11: Arrive and set camp sites

Saturday, Sept 12:

8:00 am—**Mandatory meeting** at Mather Point (we will sign waivers)

9:00 am—disperse to cleanup areas

4:00 pm—wrap up, shower, and get ready for barbecue

5:15 pm—meet at Shoshone Point, or caravan from campsite

Sunday, Sept 13:

9:00 am—meet at parking lot by railroad station for climbing outing (helmets required)

3:00 pm—head back to Phoenix

Entrance to the Park:

There is a \$25.00 entrance fee per vehicle that is good for 7 days in the park. In years past the Park has waived this fee, but at the time of this announcement, I have not verified that this is true for this year. Look for additional information in email announcements in the weeks ahead.

Camping:

Unfortunately, group campsites are **not** available this year, but as of 26th July, there are many individual campsites available at Mather Campground. You are encouraged to make individual reservations at recreation.gov. Individual campsites are \$18.00 per night and include fire rings, nearby bathrooms and water, and a pay-shower (bring quarters) at the entrance to the campground.

Cookout and Campfire:

The cookout and campfire at Shoshone Point is always a highlight of the cleanup each year. You may bring your own food to cook on the available grills. The AMC will provide charcoal for the cooking fires. There has been some interest in putting together a group 'picnic' type of meal. If you are interested in helping coordinate, or helping in any way, please contact Robert England at your earliest convenience.

Car-pooling to the Grand Canyon is encouraged as parking is limited along the rim

Directions:

Drive north on State 64 into Grand Canyon National Park. Stay on the main road until you see the sign for Mather Campground directing you to the left (south). Follow the signs to the campground kiosk. On your right will be the showers. Look on the campground kiosk for a list of assigned sites. Follow the map on the kiosk. Park at the assigned campsite and unload, set up your tent, etc. Then drive back out to the kiosk and back to the parking lot at Babbitt's General Store. Hike back to the campsite the same way, on the asphalt.

General requirements for becoming an AMC outing leader:

- Be a member for at least one year
- Take the Basic, Anchors and Lead classes (or equivalents)
- Complete a basic first aid and CPR class (8 hours or more)
- Submit an application to the Classification Chairperson
- Apprentice on at least three outings with approved outing leaders
- Get recommendation from at least five current outing leaders (including those from apprentice outings)
- Be approved by the Board of Directors.

Footnotes: Car-pooling is optional on all outings and is not part of the outing. The outing begins at the trailhead designated by the Outing Leader and ends at the same place. Each participant should bring a First Aid kit. If you leave the outing, with or without the leader's permission, you are considered to be on your own until you rejoin the group. Each participant will be required to sign an AMC Activity Release Form at the beginning of the outing. Participation in AMC outings requires club membership. Outings vary in degree of danger. When you participate in an outing you should be both physically and mentally prepared and equipped with the appropriate gear. You should always be aware of the risks involved in outdoor activities and conduct yourselves accordingly. The Outing Leader is not responsible for your safety; you are. Please contact the Outing Leader before going on an outing, discussing your capabilities with the Outing Leader. You must be over 18 years of age to participate, or must be accompanied by a parent or responsible adult, and obtain prior consent from the Outing Leader. Those accompanying minors are responsible for the minor's safety.
